An Act Concerning: Criminal Law Allows persons convicted of Class 3 or Class 4 felonies to apply for expungement with the Prisoner Review Board after they have served a tour of military duty. Action: Signed Effective: Immediately

An Act Concerning: Children Establishes procedures for the review of unfounded reports to Illinois Department of Children and Family Services and provides new rights to children in review process. Action: Signed Effective: Immediately

An Act Concerning: Transportation Permits a favorable tax levy vote to be certified at any time after the referendum election. Action: Signed Effective: Immediately

Bill No.: HB 2918

An Act Concerning: Revenue Retroactively enacts the coal and aggregate exploration equipment exemption from the sales tax to apply on and after June 1, 2003. Action: Signed Effective: Immediately

An Act Concerning: Business

Requires that websites that help connect consumers to internet childcare services, internet senior care services, and internet home care services conduct criminal background checks or place a disclaimer on website stating that backgrounds checks were not performed.

An Act Concerning: Government Closes loopholes in the Lobbyist Registration Act. Action: Signed Effective: Jan. 1, 2014

Bill No.: HB 2955

An Act Concerning: State Government Requires the Governor's Office of Management and Budget to publish the State budget on its website. Action: Signed Effective: Jan. 1, 2014

Bill No.: HB 2992

An Act Concerning: Civil Law Enhances the rights of both parents when the parent of a minor cannot care for the child. Action: Signed Effective: Jan. 1, 2014

An Act to Revise the Law by Combining Multiple Enactments and Making Technical Corrections Creates the 2013 General Revisory Act. Action: Signed Effective: Immediately

Bill No.: HB 3003

An Act Concerning: State Government Creates Childhood Cancer Research Board to assist with granting of funds from Childhood Cancer Research Fund. Action: Signed Effective: Jan. 1, 2014

Bill No.: HB 3035

An Act Concerning: State Government Changes the name of the Disaster Relief Fund to the Disaster Response and Recovery Fund and stipulates how the Illinois Emergency Management Agency may use certain funds. Action: Signed Effective: Immediately

Bill No.: HB 3043

An Act Concerning: Criminal Law Increases the penalties for criminal defacement of property. Action: Signed Effective: Immediately

Bill No.: HB 3047

An Act Concerning: State Government Creates the Governor's Office of New Americans within the Office of the Governor which is tasked with establishing a policy to expedite the process by which immigrants and their families achieve selfsufficiency. Action: Signed Effective: Jan. 1, 2014

Bill No.: HB 3054

An Act Concerning: Transportation Prohibits vehicles from having certain lights and adds vehicles belonging to the Illinois Department of Corrections and the Illinois Department of Juvenile Justice to the list of vehicles that are permitted to have these lights.
